Re-Inventing, Re-Branding, and Re-Energizing

As we gear up for the upcoming school year, we are thrilled to announce the re-inventing, re-branding, and re-energizing of our professional service organization in order to best support ALL school leaders. The *Plan of Intention* is to be the preeminent association focused on Growing Courageous Leaders. Centered around five focus areas:

Re-launch of MSAA New Administrators Coaching Program

MSAA is eager to support new administrators and provide a smooth and successful transition into administration for them. By using trained experienced and former administrators, new administrators will be coached, utilizing day-long cohort-based workshops and in-person discussions, enabling participants to develop a vision, strategies and a plan to ensure success during their first years as an administrator. The new

Principals/Assistant Principals will work with their assigned Coach to develop an entry plan for success. The entry plan will include strategies for gathering information from the school and community, engaging in conversations with key stakeholders, and formulating a plan for the first year and beyond. This program will fill the 50 hours requirement for DESE's new administrator mentoring!

Message from the Office of the Attorney General – Child Labor Laws

As we head into the summer, many teens will work because they want to earn money and others may work to contribute to family income. Together, we can support our teens to make a safe, informed, and successful transition into the working world.

The Massachusetts Child Labor Laws exist to protect minors from exploitation and to make sure their education is a top priority. The Massachusetts Attorney General's Office enforces the state's youth employment laws, which limit the number the hours workers under 18 can work and the kinds of jobs that they can do. These laws also require employers to have Youth Employment Permits (work permits) on file for all workers under 18. In Massachusetts, all of the other wage and hour laws apply equally to minors and adults (i.e. minimum wage, overtime, etc.) and these protections/requirements apply regardless of immigration status. Any teen could be a victim of child labor violations, but some may be particularly vulnerable to exploitation. By educating yourself about these laws and protections, you may be able to help protect the young people you serve from exploitation in the workforce.
