Accountability and Assistance Advisory Council (AAAC)

The Board of Elementary and Secondary Education is responsible for ensuring that DESE convenes an <u>Accountability and Assistance Advisory Council (AAAC)</u> on four occasions each year. Two designees from MSAA, selected by the Commissioner, have seats on the council: one representing elementary school principals (**Mr. Ron Sanborn**) and one representing secondary school administrators (TBD). Council members are appointed to a three-year term, with the option of remaining on the council for one additional threeyear term.

As such, the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education is requesting that our organization nominate a new secondary school administrator representative who can join the council this fall.

In this free virtual workshop, educators and school and district leaders will examine the mindsets (and mindset shifts) needed to hold conversations with students about race, and prepare to hold conversations about race and equity through regular culture-building practices.
