Keynote Speakers



Ed Cooley

Men's Basketball Coach

Providence College

On March 22, 2011, Ed Cooley became the 15th men's basketball head coach at Providence College. Providence College President, Father Brian Shanley said, "I wanted a coach that could teach our players about the game of life. I also wanted a relationship builder and Ed is a relationship builder. He will connect with our players, our fans and the entire State of Rhode Island. I could not be more thrilled to have Ed Cooley as our basketball coach."

Prior to coming to Providence, Coach Cooley spent five seasons as the head coach at Fairfield University where he earned the 2010 Ben Jobe Award as the top Minority Men's Basketball Coach in the nation after leading the team to its first postseason berth since 2003. The following season, he was named the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Coach of the Year after Fairfield won a school record 25 games and the Metro MAAC regular season title. That same year, the United States Basketball Writers Association recognized him as the District 1 Coach of the Year.

A 1994 graduate of Stonehill College, Ed Cooley was a three time captain for the basketball team. He began his coaching career at UMass Dartmouth in 1994. A native of Providence, he attended Providence Central High and earned two Rhode Island Player of the Year honors. Coach Cooley and his wife Nurys, have one daughter, Olivia and one son, Isiah.



Joanna Lohman Midfielder Washington Spirit

Joanna Lohman has been a professional athlete for fourteen years and is currently a midfielder for the Washington Spirit in the National Women's Soccer League. She has utilized her platform to impact people around the world. She is a human rights activist and a professional speaker for leading organizations. She also serves as a Sport Diplomat, traveling the world and running programs in less developed nations that promote gender equality. conflict resolution, cultural understanding, and economic development. She has helped individuals and groups find their cool by living an unabashedly authentic life based around deep-rooted acceptance and discovering a comfort in their own skin. As a fourtime Academic All-American from the Pennsylvania State University, Joanna is a proponent of lifelong learning and the 10,000 hour rule. She believes that her career is a direct result of the countless hours of practice, preparation and purpose-driven actions she accumulated over 34 years.

The platform of a professional athlete has empowered Joanna to utilize her visibility for the betterment of causes she holds close to her heart. It wasn't always clear, but her desire for positive impact illuminated itself along the way. She believes you can experience the same – or greater – growth on your own aspirational journey.
