Congratulations to Andrew Rebello, one of the top three finalists for the National Association of Secondary School Principals (NASSP) 2025 National Principal of the Year Award!

Before stepping into his current role as Assistant Superintendent of Bristol Plymouth Technical High School in August, Rebello served as Principal of Diman Regional Vocational Technical High School in Fall River, MA. During his tenure, Diman's graduation rate soared to 98%, and the school became the highest-performing high school in the region. His prior experience includes roles as Vice Principal and Central Office Administrator for Boston Public Schools. Rebello's accolades include being appointed to the Economic Development Planning Council by Governor Maura Healy and receiving the prestigious National Milken Educator of the Year award. He also serves on the Massachusetts School Administrators' Association (MSAA) Board of Directors. The 2025 NASSP National Principal of the Year will be chosen from the three finalists and announced at a gala on October 18th in Washington, DC.
